Passage:

No concise statement of the political philosophy of Confucius has come down to us, but it is possible to reconstruct its main outlines. Clearly, he believed that government should be aimed at bringing about the welfare and happiness of the whole people. This, he thought, could be done only when the government was administered by the most capable men in the country. Such capability has nothing to do with birth, or death, or position, but solely a matter of character and knowledge. These are produced by proper education. Education should therefore be widely diffused so that the most talented men in the whole population might be prepared for the business of the government. And the administration of the government should be handed over to such men, without regard to their origin.

(a) What should the government aim at?

Answer: The government should aim at bringing about the welfare and happiness of the whole people.

(b) Who should administer the country?

Answer: The country should be administered by the most capable men in the population, chosen based on character and knowledge rather than birth or position.

(c) Why should the education be widely diffused?

Answer: Education should be widely diffused to prepare the most talented individuals for the business of government and ensure that capable men are selected to administer it.

(d) Who should be handed over the administration of government?

Answer: The administration of the government should be handed over to capable men of character and knowledge, without regard to their origin.

- (C) "I, who is your teacher, will teach you" is incorrect; it should be "I, who am your teacher, will teach you."
- (D) "Waters are necessary for human beings" is incorrect; it should be "Water is necessary for human beings."
